

# **Christ the King**

(Daniel 7.13-14, Revelation 1.5-8, John 18.33-37)

## **THEME: Invite Jesus to Reign In your life as your King.**

In our Eucharist sacrifice today, we celebrate the feast of Christ the King. This celebration today reminds us again that we have a King, in the person of our Lord Jesus Christ.

In our second reading from the book of Revelation, John referred to Him as the King of Kings. In our gospel today, from the Gospel of John, "Pilate asks Jesus," "So you are a King." "Jesus answered," "You say that I am a King. For this I was born, and for this I came into the world." (Jn.18:31)

In our Lord Jesus Christ we have a loving Father as our King. A King, who has our interests at heart always. A loving King, who fights our battles, always. In Jesus we have a King who laid down his life for us, that, we may have life. A King, who bears our burdens for us.
